PROGRAM DETAILS

Aerospace Camp Experience (ACE) Program

Flight Camp (Grades 1&2)

Explore the world of flight through fun, hands-on activities and games. Each week campers will learn about the four forces of flight, tour King County International Airport. Campers make models, toys and crafts to take home every day.

Aerospace Explorers (Grades 3&4)

Discover new horizons in space exploration and aviation as you take flight in the Aviation Learning Center and blast water-fueled rockets high into the air. Each week our knowledgeable staff will lead you in fun and educational activities, games, and crafts.

Planetary Voyagers (Grades 5–7)

Take a trip that's out of this world in our Challenger Learning Center. Every camper gets to practice their astronaut skills in a microgravity activity at a local pool in addition to building robots, launching rockets, designing planes, and so much more!

Restoration Camp (Grades 5–8)

See how airplanes are transformed from spare parts to museum artifacts! View commercial airplane assembly at Boeing's Everett plant and then work with your fellow campers to build a kit plane. Visit the Kirsten Wind Tunnel at the University of Washington to see how airplanes are tested. Go to the Flying Heritage Collection to see their assortment of restored, flyable, aircraft.

Advanced Camp (Grades 7–9)

Each week, campers will get to pilot a Cessna around the Puget Sound with a certified flight instructor from Wings Aloft. Prepare for your flight in the Museum's Aviation Learning Center, and explore space in a Challenger Learning Center mission. Each camp includes an overnight on Thursday.

ACE Apprentices (Grades 10-12)

ACE Apprentices is a pathway of the Museum Apprentice Program (MAP) where participating students will learn about all aspects of a summer camp. Each Apprentice will spend time interacting with campers, developing programs, and helping out with other camp-related duties. Apprentices will also have two day-trips during the summer. ACE Apprentices must complete one week of training (July 6 – 10).

Animation Mini-Camp at Atlantic Street Center Summer Academy

Learn stop-motion animation techniques with Reel Grrls. Digital cameras, laptops and easy-to-learn software have made learning the basics of animation easy and fun. Students will be able to experiment with a variety of props to learn stop-motion techniques, claymation...and of course, storytelling.

Bellevue Community College Summer Science Camp

The Summer Science Camp seeks to instill a sense of enthusiasm and inquisitiveness about science in 5th and 6th graders. We offer "hands-on, minds-on" experiences in a variety of scientific disciplines, including astronomy, biology, botany, chemistry, earth science, physics and more.

Camp Cornet

Camp Cornet is located 9 miles south of Anacortes on Highway 20 in the Deception Pass State Park on Whidbey Island. The camp is in a beautiful setting on the shores of Cornet Bay with several lakes nearby. As exceptionally well-trained staff work to provide campers with the highest caliber of programs and care. Staff members include Specialists in Nature, Arts & Crafts, Swimming Supervision and Recreation, an Activities Program Coordinator, a Health Officer, trained volunteer counselors and a dedicated Head Cook and Kitchen staff working alongside the Director and Assistant Camp Director. Mike Rommel serves as director with 4 years of experience at Camp Cornet and years of experience in Whatcom County sports programs.

Camp Fire (Day Camp)

Day Camp is about doing, not watching. It's about enjoying nature and living outdoors, and working together with kids from a variety of socioeconomic, racial, cultural, religious and disabled populations. Together the youth share common experiences while at camp, and learn to focus on similarities and abilities. Mutual respect and trust form between campers as they rely on one another.

And as campers receive praise and encouragement from their counselors and their peers, they grow in self-confidence and competence, with social skills and friends that last for years to come.

Camp Fire (Camp Sealth)

Located on 1.5 miles of beach on Vashon Island, Washington, Camp Sealth's pristine location provides areas for beach and water activities. The 400 acres of woods filled with trails, wildlife and remote campsites provides the setting for daily adventures. Fun, friends and new adventures away from home create a valuable and memorable experience. Each child brings home a new sense of self-confidence, independence, teamwork and social skills that last a lifetime. The entire Camp Sealth staff is dedicated to enriching children's lives.

Camp Invention

Camp Invention is a week-long summer enrichment day program offered in local communities for children entering first through sixth grades. Participating daily in five activity-oriented thematic modules, children enhance their understanding of science, math, history, and the arts while having lots of fun. This exciting program invites children to let their imaginations run wild through teamwork, creative problem solving, and inventive thinking.

Camp River Ranch

River Ranch offers a variety of programs for all girls including swimming, boating, crafts, environmental education, outdoor skills and outdoor cooking. In addition, specialty programs include horseback riding both English and Western, biking, backpacking, leadership, and drama. We have a diverse staff that is committed to a positive experience for all the campers.

Camp Robbinswold

All programs at Camp Robbinswold include swimming, boating, crafts, marine biology, outdoor skills and outdoor cooking. Specialty programs include the arts (dramatics, pottery, etc.), windsurfing, sailing, biking, llama tripping, backpacking and leadership. We have a diverse staff with a variety of these skills.

Camp St. Albans

A summer overnight experience for individual girls. Camps run from 4 to 14 days and include activities like arts, nature, horses, water, boating, leadership, adventure tripping, and general camp fun.

Camp St. Albans (One Day Events)

Come to camp for just one day! These ten one-day events for girls 7-12 are held at Camp St. Albans from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm in the summer. Each day is full of activities like boating, swimming, and arts & crafts, as well as a specific focus for the day.

Canoe Island French Camp

Organization: Canoe Island French Camp was founded in 1969 and today is a non-profit organization dedicated to sharing the French language and culture with youth in a healthy outdoor environment. Canoe Island French Camp is accredited by the American Camp Association and is a member of the Western Association of Independent Camps.

Mornings at camp are devoted to French language classes and activities: fencing, French cuisine and culture, archery, theater, art, and photography. In the afternoon campers choose each day between swimming, sailing, kayaking, archery, art, rock climbing and sports, all with French vocabulary. Campfires, theatrical and musical productions, beach cookouts, camp-wide games, and astronomy fill the evenings. During the three-week sessions campers board an exploratory vessel to seek orca whales other wildlife that inhabit the Salish Sea. A gala Bon Voyage Banquet and talent show end each session.

Children's Technology Workshop – Animation Club Workshop

Make an animated movie! Develop a story, create characters, and design a set and props. Then use a webcam and stop motion software to film the footage and add titles, credits, narrative, music and sound effects to create the perfect production. We'll celebrate with a film festival on Thursday!

Children's Technology Workshop – Gamemaker Workshop

Design an age-appropriate non-violent video game! At the end of the week, you'll take home a CD-ROM containing your game files so you can play at home.

Children's Technology Workshop – Robotics Club Workshop

Ready for a whole new level of fun? Check out Robotics Club! This workshop introduces kids to construction techniques and programming as they complete LEGO-based control systems and robotics projects.

College Quest

Cougar Quest - WSU

Cougar Quest is a summer academic camp on the campus of Washington State University designed especially for young people entering grades 7 through 12 in the fall of 2009. It is an exciting week-long camp where you choose your route to discovery. Your days will be filled with hands-on activities led by world class Washington State University faculty. At Cougar Quest, learning is fun! When Cougar Quest workshops end, exploration of the Washington State University campus begins with social and recreational activities.
